Purpose

The Collaboration Game is based on a popular LEGO simulation game from the business world. Kate has adapted it to reflect the realities of teamwork in an educational setting. The purpose of the game is to get an overview of the fundamentals of collaboration, communication and coaching (the 3 C's). Each participant experiences what it is like to be a key stakeholder in a child's education, creating an awareness of why the 3 C's are so beneficial to all members of your community.

Requirements

- To have the best experience possible, the ideal number of participants in 10-14.
- The Collaboration Game takes a total of 90 minutes.
- There is a lot of movement involved in the game so a classroom is a perfect space to use. Anywhere that has enough tables for each participant to have a seat, with plenty of room to move around will do perfectly
- Kate looks after all of the resources that you will need.

Outcomes

A hands on experience that your team will continue to talk about, long after the LEGO is packed away. You will explore:

- The importance of expectations and how you can set them together as a team
- Clear communication that benefits every member of your school community
- Understanding that collaboration is working together to achieve something that you couldn't do as a group of individuals working in isolation
